### PROJECT SPONSOR

Alameda County Public Works Agency

### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

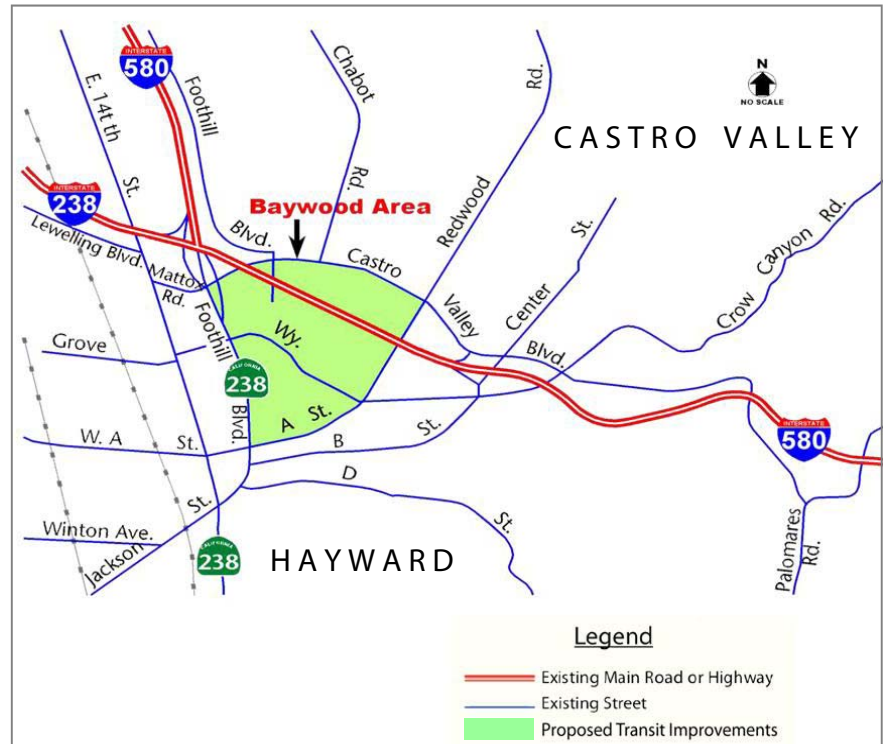
This project is designed to provide local improvements to help alleviate traffic congestion and reduce regional bypass and cut through traffic on numerous arterial, collector and local roads in the Baywood area of unincorporated Alameda County.

### PROJECT STATUS

In May 2006 the Alameda County Board of Supervisors endorsed a list of potential projects in the Baywood area for use of Measure B funds. The County made a second presentation regarding their alternative recommendation for the westerly end of Castro Valley Boulevard to the Castro Valley Municipal Advisory Council (CVMAC) in September 2009; it was subsequently approved by the CVMAC. The Alameda County Public Works Agency (ACPWA) met with Caltrans to discuss alternatives and requirements for implementing the improvement modification on the State Highway System; Caltrans comments were incorporated into the study. The ACPWA released the RFP for the Traffic Circulation Study in July 2011 and proposals were submitted in August 2011. A consultant has been selected; development of the study will begin spring 2012.
