Project Category

Disabled Services: Services primarily created for mobility for people with disabilities.

Meals on Wheels: Delivery of meals.

Senior & Disabled

Services: Transportation services for seniors and disabled.

Senior Services: Services primarily created for senior mobility.

Other: Use Other if none of the above apply, and define other by selecting Project Type and providing Project Description.

Project Phase

Environmental: Preparation of environmental documents, such as those related to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) or

the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA).

New Construction: Construction of a new capital project.
