The reported expenditures in FY 12-13 were significantly more than the amount of Measure B funds received in FY 12-13. Two big projects were implemented in FY 12-13 using Measure B funds including 1) Update of the Bikeways and Pedestrian Master Plan and 2) Construction of the West Dublin BART-Golden Gate Drive Improvement project.

The reserved Measure B funds are planned to be used for projects and programs prioritized in the City adopted Bikeways and Pedestrian Master Plan. Once enough Measure B funds are collected to implement a project, it gets included in the City's Capital Improvement Program and approved by the City Council for implementation.

Some Measure B funds (\$15,334) were used to implement programs included in the City Bikeways Master Plan to encourage bicycling and improve safety for bicyclists.

These funds were used to implement the following: 1) promotional campaign sponsorship of National Bike Month, installation of two Bike-to-Work energizer stations and purchase of giveaways and promotional materials; 2) staff coordination and purchase of giveaways/materials for the Walk and Roll to School, Bike Safety classes, bike stakeholders workshops and other bike related activities including bike tire repair clinic, bike donation drive, bike to school days, bike to the Market day and Team Bike Challenge.

Reserves are programmed for the Annual Street Overlay Program. As recommended by the City's recent Pavement Management Program Report, the annual street overlay program is \$625,000 per year to maintain streets in a good condition. Due to timing of the overlay project during the summer, improvements are completed after June 30, and thus, MB funds are carried forward into next fiscal year.

Agencies are expected to expend their planned expenditures from their individual projects and/or and reserve funds. Did you expend the planned funds? Did you expend more than anticipated?

Approximately 45% of planned expenditures were expended in FY 2012-2013 (by June 30, 2013). The street pavement overlay project was on-going in summer 2013 and completed in September 2013. It is anticipated that 100% of FY 2012-2013 planned expenditures were utilized for the project. It is not anticipated that the project expended more than planned.

14b.If your agency <u>did not expend the planned amount</u>, please provide a detailed justification on why dollars were not spent, reference specific projects.

Typical construction season for street resurfacing projects is May through September months. The construction window narrows further when working near schools in order to minimize traffic impacts. Therefore, due to project construction timing and the end of fiscal year being June 30, the 2013 Annual Street Overlay Program improvements continued into FY 2013-2014 and were completed in September. The 2013 Annual Street Overlay included pavement resurfacing in front of a public school.
