increase Fiscal Year 2014-2015 Budget by \$816,319 to balance the allocated funds.

	Due to project timing with securing Federal funds, \$232,938 of Local Streets and Roads funds were not expended in Fiscal Year 2013-2014 as planned. This project will take place in Fiscal Year 2014-2015. Also, the planned use of Measure B funding was reduced by \$71,206 as the City decided to use non-Measure B funding source for this amount. Finally, some of the Measure B balance was saved due to lower than anticipated bids received for Fiscal Year 2012-2013 Annual Street Overlay Project (construction completed in Fiscal Year 2014-2015). These factors resulted in \$116,820 of unspent Local Streets and Roads Funds.
