The Newark City Council has already approved expenditures for the 2014 curb, gutter, and sidewalk replacement program. The work is in the planning phase now, and construction will take place in spring/summer 2014. The majority of the work should occur (and funds will be used) in June 2014.

Allocating reserves for the 2015 curb, gutter, and sidewalk replacement program will be proposed to the Newark City Council as part of our 2014 – 2016 Biennial Budget process. Approval is scheduled for June 2014. The 2015 curb, gutter, and sidewalk replacement program work will occur (use of funds) in spring/summer 2015.

Allocating reserves for the 2015 street maintenance program will be proposed to the Newark City Council as part of our 2014 – 2016 Biennial Budget process. Approval is scheduled for June 2014. The 2015 street maintenance program work will follow a similar timeline [planning in winter 2014, out to bid in spring 2015, and construction (use of funds) in summer 2015].
