# WHAT IS SB 1?

### In April 2017, Governor Jerry Brown signed into law Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017.

This landmark funding program invests approximately \$5.4 billion annually in state and local roads, public transit and active transportation programs through increases in the gas and diesel taxes and the vehicle registration fee. These funds help stretch our local, voter approved transportation sales tax dollars to deliver projects faster.

### PROJECTS AT RISK

Proposition 6 on the November 2018 ballot is intended to repeal SB 1. If SB 1 is repealed, Alameda County projects to improve highways, rail, goods movement, roads, bridges, trails and pedestrian safety projects would be delayed indefinitely.

- » Express Lane expansions
- » Port modernization and efficiency and safety projects
- » Local community rail safety crossing improvements
- » East Bay Greenway, Bay Trail, Iron Horse Trail and other major trails
- » Interregional rail service expansion
- » Arterial improvements throughout the county including Dublin Boulevard extension, East 14th/ Mission, San Pablo Avenue and others throughout the County
- » Local streets and pedestrian safety projects
