Major gap between tricities and tri-valley regions






Guiding Project Goals

- 5. Identify and **preserve** the historic water and rail infrastructure within Niles Canyon







Based on assessment of **user experience**, impact to **environmental** and **historical resources**, and **cost** to implement


Recommends a **phased** trail development






