


Measure B Specialized Transportation for Seniors and People with Disabilities

- 10 years of funding trips in Alameda County
- 10.45% of Measure B net revenues for Paratransit = \$9-10 Million per year
- Largest sales tax supported paratransit program in the Bay Area
- Funds 25% of all Alameda County trips for seniors
   & people with disabilities




