 - Collect travel demand data, transportation infrastructure data and multimodal traffic data
- Identify Existing and Future Conditions and Perform Needs Assessment for the Arterial Network
- 4. Develop Vision, Goals and Objectives for the Plan
 - Consistent with Countywide Transportation Plan goals yet address the needs of the county arterial system
- 5. Develop Multimodal Performance Measures
 - Have the ability to assess the planning and operations concepts such as Complete Streets, Fix-it-First, and Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) methods
- 6. Develop Roadway Typology
 - Supplement the existing auto oriented functional class for arterials with guidance to support all users and land use
 - Provide a framework for designing Complete Streets
- Identify Future Short- and Long-Term Improvements by Mode and Other Supportive Operational Programs and Strategies
 - Evaluate and identify improvements for all modal elements and operational programs
 - Revisit and re-evaluate the initial baseline Arterial Network
- 8. Develop Traffic Management Coordination Strategies, Policies and Best Practices
 - o Expand on Task 7 related to Traffic Management
 - Focus coordination with local jurisdictions and Caltrans to develop a strategy for implementation of ITS/traffic management technologies for effectively maximizing the operational capacity of the system
