Alameda County Program Elements

- Open to all schools in Alameda County
 - No longer have competitive application process
 - Multi-pronged support system to allow schools to tailor program to their needs
 - Tiered recognition program
 - Free education & encouragement programs
 - Free safety items
- Focus on safety through School Site Assessments
 - Provided 30 site assessments in 2015-2016, up from 8 or less per prior years
 - Targeting 40 site assessments in 2016-2017 school year
 - Data-driven approach to prioritizing schools

Expanded Resources

- Resource Center available online
 - Toolkits for all major events and SR2S activities
 - Request forms for SR2S resources
 - Tips and best practices
- Focus on taskforce meetings for inperson support
- Site Coordinators provide support tailored to a school's specific needs

Leveraging Opportunities

- Coordination with other programs
 - Affordable Student Transit Pass Pilot Program
 - CIP funding to implement small school site infrastructure improvements: \$1.3M available in 2017/2018
 - Site Assessments can enable schools and cities to get ready to apply for Active Transportation Funds

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Elementary and Middle School Programming

- Countywide Events
 - International Walk and Roll to School Day
 - Golden Sneaker Contest
 - Bike to School Day
- Enhancing Safety and maintaining enthusiasm throughout the year
 - Rock the Block Theatre Show teaching bike and pedestrian safety
 - Bike and Pedestrian Safety Rodeos
 - BikeMobile visits
 - Walking School Buses and Bike Trains
 - Monthly Themed Walk & Roll to School Days



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High School Program

- One of few formal high school programs in nation
- SR2S implemented with a class or club at each school
- Youth Task Force
 - Representatives from each high school meet monthly at Alameda CTC







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
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Program Evolution

- Innovation has been key to program's success
- Increase focus on capital improvements
 - Increase number of site assessments
 - \$1.3M available in CIP
 - Addresses one of the biggest barriers to mode shift as expressed by parents in surveys
- Increase amount of direct safety education and training for students and families
 - SR2S participation allows more children to benefit from safety training and education
 - Rock the block, Drive your Bike, Bike and Pedestrian Rodeos, Bikemobile visits, etc.

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Alameda County Program Administration

- 2006 through 2011 funded with Measure B grant funds
- 2010 MTC acted to support Safe Routes to Schools programs with federal funds
- 2011 Alameda CTC put out consultant contract for competitive bid and performs on-going program administration

Alameda County Program Contracts

Contract 1


- Alta Planning and Design
- Two Year Contract: \$2.3 M

Contract 2

- Three year (11/2013 6/2016): \$4.6 M
 - Amendment #1 additional \$600,000
 - Amendment #2 time extension to 6/2017
- Amendment #3 additional \$1.48 M for total of \$6,680,000
- Uses all federally obligated funding under OBAG Cycle 1 funds and newly identified TFCA funds (subject to PPC and Commission approval)

Alameda County Safe Routes to Schools Program





Recommendation:

Approve and authorize the Executive Director to execute Amendment No. 3 to Professional Services Agreement No. A13-0001 with Alta Planning + Design, Inc. for an additional \$1,480,000 for a total not-to exceed amount of \$6,680,000 for project implementation of the Safe Routes to School Program.

Option 1: Program \$100,000 of proposed FY 2016-2017 budget for Safety Line Item that includes direct student safety training and site assessments

Option 2: Program \$100,000 of proposed FY 2016-2017 budget to a specific subconsultant contract or activity

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
