Transit Plan Recap

- Alameda CTC approved the Alameda County Transit Plan in June 2016
- Created the Commission's Transit Committee
- Transit Plan recommendations included in the 2016 Countywide Transportation Plan

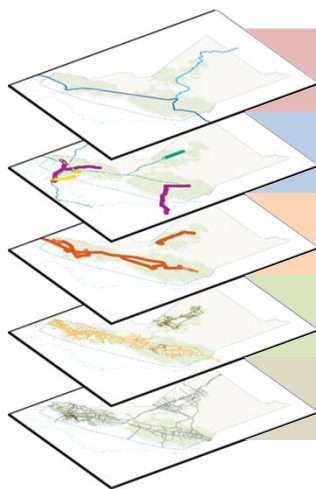

Service Tiers



Inter-Regional

For longer-distance travel through multiple counties. Typically planned within the context of statewide and inter-city rail services.

Regional Express

For travel between major activity nodes and employment centers where there is substantial point to point travel.

Urban Rapid

For travel to major activity nodes such as employment centers from dispersed major transit origins.

Local Frequent and Community Connector

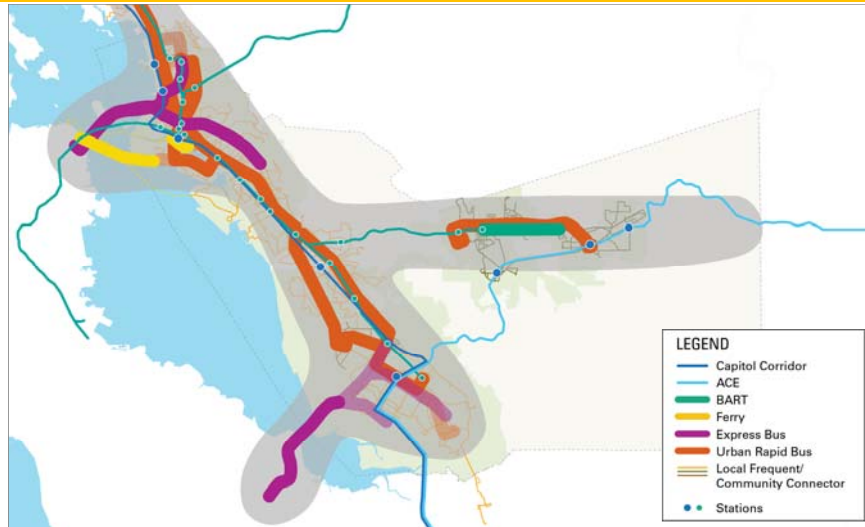
For travel along a corridor with productive, dispersed origins, and for community access in lower productive areas. Serves schools, medical facilities, shopping.

Streets Plus

Street network provides right-of-way for bus services, and first- and last-mile access to all transit.



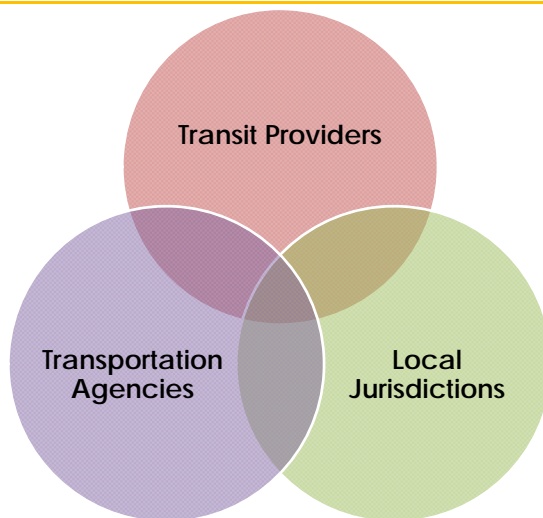
Network Recommendations



Note- The Recommendations presented here are conceptual. Specific routing alignments and termini will be determined in future studies.



Coordinating Partners



Implementation Actions

- Monitor performance as part of annual reporting
- Develop funding strategy with partners for transit funding (e.g. RM3, state transportation bill)
- Facilitate better dialogue and coordination between cities and transit agencies through ACTAC Information Sharing Forum
- Track projects that have implications for Vision Network Recommendations



Plans and Programs

- Corridor Studies
 - San Pablo Avenue RFP is currently soliciting proposals
 - East 14th/Mission RFP will be released this spring
- Rail Strategy Study
- Partner with transit agencies and cities on other local- or transit agency-led efforts
- Monitor and advise on regional transit efforts
- Affordable Student Transit Pass Program
