


Six Countywide Plans Inform Long-Range Plans

- Multimodal specific plans
 - Goods Movement Plan
 - Transit Plan
 - Multimodal Arterial Plan
 - Community Based Transportation Plans
 - Bicycle Plan
 - Pedestrian Plan
- Form basis of next CWTP
- Inform Regional Transportation Plan



MODAL PLAN UPDATE

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All Modal Plans Underway

- Develop a long-range Alameda County network vision for each mode
- Identify near- and long-term transportation needs
- Develop a near- and long-term strategy to implement the long-range vision
- Complete by 2015 to feed into the Countywide Transportation Plan/Regional Transportation Plan

Goods Movement

WHAT A COUNTYWIDE GOODS MOVEMENT PLAN PROVIDES

- Recognize the role of goods movement to support Alameda County population and economy
- Capture benefits of the county's larger goods movement role — competitiveness
 - Job diversity and workforce development
- Encourage innovation
 - Advanced operations and design concepts
 - Advanced and green technology
- Address impacts
 - Align policies to avoid conflicts — improve public health
 - Advocate — Alameda County's state and national role



Multimodal Arterial Plan

WHAT A COUNTYWIDE MULTIMODAL ARTERIAL PLAN PROVIDES

- Understand existing role and function of countywide major arterial corridors by mode
- Identify a countywide arterial network that supports all modes and connects to surrounding land uses
- Improve overall mobility and efficiency, access to land use, modal connectivity, safety and efficiency of the arterial network, including Intelligent Transportation Systems
- Prioritize short- and long-term improvement



Overarching Transit Plan Goals

- Identify an integrated transit network
- Address all transit modes as well as land use, economic development, social equity, environmental and financial sustainability
- Identify complementary ADA strategy
- Identify a strategy for enhancing agency coordination
- Prioritize short- and long-term improvement



AC Transit Inclusion in the Countywide Transit Plan

- Objectives:
 - Develop, analyze and rank operational and capital improvements for AC Transit's major corridors
 - Recommend near- and long-term investment strategies
 - Develop and refine projects for inclusion in Countywide Transit Plans, RTP and potential FTA funding
- Integration with Countywide Transit Plan ensures more efficient and effective coordination and collaboration between the two efforts
- Seek Commission approval to add AC Transit to study



Recommendation

- Approve increasing not to exceed budget for transit plan to include AC Transit work
