The City of Dublin has established an Operational Fund Reserve as per the provisions of the MPFA. The total amount retained in such fund is not supposed to exceed 50 percent of anticipated annual combined revenues from Measure B and VRF funds. This fund is a revolving fund and is not subject to an expenditure timeframe. In 2012/13 FY the City designated \$118,014 to this fund. As of June 30, 2013 there were \$76,266 unspent funds in this reserve. Additionally, one of the two planned projects (Traffic Operation Center Communications Upgrade) started late and some of the invoices were not paid before June 30, 2013. There was an encumbered balance of \$201,280 on June 30, 2013 . The second project (Signal Maintenance) has \$13,163 left over, which is less than 30% of the total project cost of \$169,660. Detail explanation is provided in question 14.

The City established an Operations Fund Reserve as of FY 12/13 compliance report. The total allocation to this fund was \$118,014. The City Council approved the Planned project "Traffic Operations Center Communication Upgrade" on April 2, 2013 and allocated additional \$41,748 to this project from the Operation Fund Reserve. This additional allocation reduced the Operation Fund Reserve to \$76,266.

Project 1. Traffic Operations Center Communication Upgrade

Project 1 was planned to have a budget of \$200,000, but the City decided to use additional funds from Operations Fund Reserve in the amount of \$41,748. This brought the total VRF portion of the project cost to \$241,748. The project was approved by the City Council on 04/02/13 and due to the start of the project in the later part of the FY many invoices were not paid as of June 30, 2013. There was a remaining balance of \$201,280. This amount is above the 30% of the total budget. The City has paid the invoices after the June 30, 2013, and currently we do not see a problem with spending the budgeted amount.

Project 2. 12/13 Traffic Signal & Street Light Maintenance

This project was planned to have a budget of \$170,000 but the actual budget was established at 169,660. At the end of June 30, 2013 there were \$13,163 remaining funds. The City has rolled over this amount to the FY 13/14 and will use these funds as per the planned projects in FY 13/14.

	The Signage was not used as the funding was allocated for maintenance work that occurs intermittently and does not have a specific project location.
