

The Alameda County **Transportation Commission is** a newly-formed countywide transportation agency, resulting from a merger of the **Alameda County Congestion** Management Agency (ACCMA) and the Alameda County **Transportation Improvement** Authority (ACTIA). Our mission is to plan, fund and deliver a broad spectrum of transportation projects and programs to enhance mobility throughout Alameda County. The merger eliminates redundancies and creates efficiencies in planning, programs and project delivery and streamlines legislative, policy and funding efforts.

Presentations:

Alameda Countywide Transportation Planning

Major transportation planning is underway to guide local, state and federal funding for project and program implementation to maintain, operate and expand the multimodal transportation systems in Alameda County.

Route 84 Expressway Update

Project involves widening a 4.6-mile section of Isabel Avenue, from Ruby Hill Drive to Jack London Boulevard, expanding from two lanes to four lanes and to six lanes.

I-580 Corridor Update

Projects include congestion relief and mobility enhancements in the I-580 Corridor, including High Occupancy Toll (HOT) lanes.

Alamo Canal Trail Update

Project involves construction of a multi-use trail segment located under I-580 near the Dublin Civic Center. Segment will create a 3.6-mile continuous path, linking the cities of Dublin and Pleasanton, and to the Iron Horse Trail.

WHEELS Transit Advancements

Tri-Valley Rapid Transit System offers environmentally friendly technology with fasters travel, fewer stops and a frequent schedule. WHEELS public transit offers a range of accessible options for seniors and people with disabilities, such as Travel Training, Dial-a-Ride Paratransit Services and Senior Housing Shuttles.


