	The City of Emeryville expended \$87,471 during FY2012-13 compared to the planned amount of \$90,632 (Table 3 FY2011-12). The variance of \$3,161 is due to the difference in actual VRF pass-through revenue plus interest received for FY2012-13 of \$42,604 compared to estimated amount of \$45,765.
