Alameda CTC and Local Transportation Plans

Meet Alameda County's newly formed countywide transportation agency. Hear about agency's innovative approaches to transportation planning and funding.

East Bay Greenway

The project proposes to build a 12-mile walking and biking path under the elevated BART tracks between Oakland and Hayward in Alameda County. The vision is to provide a safe, landscaped, continuous corridor that offers car-free access to transit, schools, shopping, and community resources.

Senior Travel Training

Alameda County is at the cutting edge of preparing for the coming "boom" in the senior-aged population, with numbers expected to more than double in the next twenty years. Hear efforts that support mobility opportunities for seniors and people with disabilities.

I-880 Corridor Improvements

Many projects are underway to improve the efficiency of the I-880 Corridor. This presentation will cover improvements through Central Alameda County.

Route 238 Improvements

Construction began this year on this project to make significant improvements through Hayward. Hear about construction activities and plans for the project's final implementation.

Lewelling/East Lewelling Project

The first of a two-phase project to widen East Lewelling Blvd. to East 14th Street, and to move utilities underground in the project area. Widens Lewelling between Hesperian Blvd. and Meekland Ave. and includes streetscape improvements.

The Alameda County Transportation Commission is a newly-formed countywide transportation agency, resulting from a merger of the Alameda County Congestion Management Agency (ACCMA) and the Alameda County Transportation Improvement Authority (ACTIA). Its mission is to plan, fund and deliver a broad spectrum of transportation projects and programs to enhance mobility throughout Alameda County. The merger eliminates redundancies and creates efficiencies in planning, programs and project delivery and streamlines legislative, policy and funding efforts.

Alameda County Transportation Improvement Authority

ACTIA

ACTIA was formed to implement Measure B in Alameda County. Authorized by 81.5% of voters in 2000, Measure B is a 20-year half-cent countywide sales tax, in place from 2002-2022. The revenues fund a voter-approved Expenditure Plan aimed at reducing congestion and improving transportation by addressing all modes of travel in all areas of Alameda County.

Alameda County Congestion Management Agency

ACCMA

ACCMA was formed in 1991, mandated by Proposition 111 of 1990. This voter mandate added nine cents per gallon to the state fuel tax to fund local, regional and state transportation projects and services. Its primary responsibility is to coordinate transportation planning, funding and other activities in a congestion management program.
