During Fiscal Year 2012-2013, VRF revenue and existing fund balances exceeded Measure B expenditures. Ending balance will be expended on street resurfacing, multiuse trail repair, slurry seal, safe routes to school improvements, and storm drain and culvert repair. Money that cannot be entirely spent in FY2013-2014 will be carried over and spent in future fiscal years in compliance with the Timely Use of Funds policy.

5. If applicable, why were the reported expenditures in FY 12-13 more than the amount of VRF funds the agency received in FY 12-13? How did you use VRF funds from a previous fiscal year(s)?

FY12-13 Expenditures did not exceed the FY12-13 allocation.

The VRF **Undesignated Fund Reserve** will be used for general transportation needs including project development, studies, or contingencies and construction. The VRF **Capital Fund Reserve** will be used for multiuse trail repair, slurry seal, safe routes to school improvements, and storm drain and culvert repair.

All projects for each fund reserve are subject to review and require approval through the City's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) budget authorization process. Projects in the FY12-13 and FY13-14 CIP have already been approved by City Council; no additional agency approval is required. The City is currently drafting a three year Capital Improvement Program (FY14-15 through FY16-17) which will be reviewed/approved by the City Council in summer 2014.

14a.Describe your agency's effectiveness at meeting your planned FY 12-13 expenditures reported in the last compliance report and reasons for any variations. Agencies are expected to expend their planned expenditures from their individual projects and/or and reserve funds. Did you expend the planned funds? Did you expend more than anticipated?

The City spent \$311,179 of the \$345,400 VRF funds anticipated in FY12-13. Due to fewer projects being designed, bids coming in lower than expected, and a project delay due to permitting, there was an overall balance of \$34,221. The City was able to successfully reprogram the available funds within the FY13-16 reserve window.

14b.If your agency <u>did not expend the planned amount</u>, please provide a detailed justification on why dollars were not spent, reference specific projects.

Due to limited design staff availability, the City did not complete the estimated storm drain and culvert repair projects as expected, CIP201325 "Storm Drain and Culvert Repair. Funds for this project have been allocated to FY13-14 and FY14-15. Bids came in lower than expected for CIP201201 "Street Resurfacing" leaving a balance available. Environmental permitting delayed project CIP200248 "Multiuse Trail Repair" and therefore funds have been reallocated to FY13-14. Funds not spent by these projects, in addition to projects which were completed but not anticipated in FY12-13, resulted in an overall balance of \$34,221.
