## Why These Plans are Important to Us

- Create a premier transportation system, connected and multi-modal
- Complete communities, both livable and affordable
- Provide a sustainable transportation system: economically, environmentally and equitably



## Planning in a New Context

#### **New Legislative Environment**

- Assembly Bill 32: The California Global Warming Solutions Act
- California Senate Bill 375: Redesigning Communities to Reduce Greenhouse Gases and developing a Sustainable Communities Strategy
- MTC's Resolution 3434: Transit-Oriented Development (TOD) Policy for Regional Transit Expansion Projects.



#### Relationship of Regional and Countywide Transportation Planning Activities

- Regional: SCS/RTP
  - Adoption by MTC and ABAG Spring 2013
- Countywide activities inform regional activities
- Countywide: CWTP-TEP
  - Administrative Draft CWTP and TEP Parameters released September 2011
  - Fall 2011 Public Outreach
  - Draft Plans approved December 2011/January 2012
  - Final Plans adopted May 2012
  - TEP placed on November 2012 ballot



#### Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) Overview

- Long-range transportation planning and investment document for Bay Area (to 2040)
  - ☐ Developed by Metropolitan Transportation Commission
  - □ Defines investments of federal, state and regional dollars to 9-County Bay Area
  - □ Estimate for the 2040 RTP: \$254 Billion (28 Year total): Discretionary \$67 Billion
  - □ Alameda County discretionary share: \$6.8 Billion
    - □1/3 state and federal, 2/3 local



#### Countywide Transportation Plan Overview

- Defines 25-year countywide transportation needs, priorities and investment
- Guides eligibility for regional funding and supports the goals of the regional transportation plan and sustainable communities strategy
- Integrates land use and transportation at the countywide level
- Updated every 4 years
- Informs the Transportation Expenditure Plan





## Alameda County Transportation Expenditure Plan (TEP) 2012

- Current "Measure B" (½ cent sales tax)
  - Passed by voters 1986
  - Reauthorized 2000 (with 81.5% support)
  - Valid 2002-2022
- Revenue Split:
  - 60% Programs
  - 40% Capital Projects


The TEP is a major funding stream in Alameda County.



#### **Current Measure B Shortfall**

#### Measure B Revenue Forecasts:

- Original....\$2.9 billion
- Current.....\$2.1 billion
- Projected Gap...\$800 million

#### **Alameda County Congestion** Management Program (CMP) 2011

- · Required by law; updated every 2 years
- 7 year Planning Document
- Implements Countywide Transportation Plan
- Five elements:
  - Level Of Service standards, Performance, Travel Demand, Land Use, Capital Improvement
- Identifies corridor and other studies

- Transit Oriented Development Planning
  - Priority Development Area Implementation
    - MacArthur Transit Village
    - Coliseum BART Transit Village
    - Downtown Berkeley
  - Ashby/Ed Roberts Campus
- Community Based Transportation Planning
  - Recommendations being implemented with Lifeline Transportation funds provided by MTC
- Truck Parking Facilities Study
- Guaranteed Ride Home Program
- Corridor Studies (inform the CWTP)
- Others
