

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

MEETING MINUTES

1. Welcome and Introductions

Paratransit Coordinator Naomi Armenta called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. The meeting began with introductions and a review of the meeting outcomes.

2. Public Comment

There was no public comment.

3. Review of April 9, 2013 Minutes

TAC members reviewed the meeting minutes from April 9, 2013 and by consensus approved them as written.

4. PAPCO Program Plan Fiscal Year 2013-14 and Gap Cycle 5 Program Update

Naomi Armenta gave an update on the PAPCO Program Plan Review process which took place in April. She noted that the recommendation will be taken to the committees and to the Commission in June. The staff memo included a summary of the total funds requested, the amount that was recommended and highlights of each jurisdiction's proposed programs for the fiscal year. She also noted that no programs required conditional funding. Naomi Armenta also provided an update on the Gap Cycle 5 Program and noted the summary handout in the agenda packet. She noted 12 applicants received funding out of the 17 that applied. She emphasized that some applicants only received partial funding from their original requests. Lastly, Naomi mentioned the funding recommendation is available for review under the June committee agenda items on the Alameda CTC website.

Questions and feedback from TAC members:

- Can you provide more information on the discussion regarding the Lions Center for the Blind's application and why this application was not funded? Staff reviewed the Lions Center for the Blind's application and noted that the amount requested was very high. Staff was not able to fully or partially fund this request but is working to include the Lions Center for the Blind in the Countywide Travel Training Working Group meetings for future collaborations with other partners.
- Did Center for Elders' Independence (CEI) apply for grant funding? No, CEI did not apply for Gap Grant Funding. CEI applied for funding through the Federal 5310 Grant process. Their primary funding is actually through Medi-Cal.

5. Update on HDTS/WSBTS

Krystle Pasco gave an update on the Hospital Discharge Transportation Service (HDTS) and the Wheelchair Scooter Breakdown Transportation Service (WSBTS) programs. She stated that the Alameda CTC administers two specialized mobility programs that are available to seniors and persons with disabilities in Alameda County. The HDTS program provides accessible rides home or to a nursing facility upon discharge from a participating hospital and is free to riders. Likewise, the WSBTS program provides rides home or to a repair facility for stranded individuals who are experiencing a breakdown and is free to riders.

Krystle reported that in April there were 34 rides for the HDTS program and in March there were 26 rides. Overall, staff is anticipating an increase in ridership this fiscal year. Krystle then reported on HDTS ridership by facility and noted Alameda Hospital as a new facility to the program. Krystle then reported that in April there were 13 rides for the WSBTS program and in March there were 12 rides. Overall, this program's ridership has increased throughout this fiscal year and staff anticipates an increase in ridership from last fiscal year.

Lastly, the contract that provides these services will be going through an RFP process early next fiscal year. More updates will be provided soon.

Questions and feedback from TAC members:

- How long will the new contract last? The new contract will be renewed on an annual basis.
- When does the annual in service training take place? Staff conducts the annual in service training between the months of January and March.
- A member suggested that we reach out to police and fire departments and possibly do a presentation on our programs.
- What are the issues surrounding wheelchair and scooter repair in the county? Staff noted that some of the issues include limited repair facilities, exclusivity, availability

and responsiveness, or buying wheelchairs on the internet or from other individuals. Staff is currently referring individuals to CIL's repair facility. National Seating and Mobility is also another service for wheelchair repair that is available outside of Alameda County.

6. Review Meals on Wheels Programs Practice and Policies

Naomi Armenta reviewed the Meals on Wheels programs practice and policies and noted that staff received a request for funding from an Alameda County Meals on Wheels provider. As a result staff wanted to discuss the use of Measure B funds, in relation to the implementation guidelines, to support Alameda County Meals on Wheels programs.

Naomi went over the background of the Meals on Wheels program and noted that after the 2000 measure, the earliest programs existed through ACTIA and more specifically the City of Hayward's paratransit program. Staff stated Measure B financed Meals on Wheels programs because theoretically these trips are more efficient than bringing seniors to the congregate meal sites. Consumers were concerned that this may reinforce keeping individuals at home and not in the community. However, staff stated some of the individuals served may be physically unable to take a trip to a meal site, and therefore there is an inherent need for this type of service. Further discussion showed that Meals on Wheels has really no connection to the transportation programs.

Naomi also stated that other counties may finance their Meals on Wheels programs through other funding sources, but Alameda County devotes transportation sales tax funding more to our paratransit programs. There was also some discussion of coordination or referrals with volunteer driver programs.

Naomi noted the jurisdictions in Alameda County that are currently using Measure B funding for Meals on Wheels which include the Cities of Albany, Emeryville, Fremont, Hayward and Newark. This funding ranges from less than 1% to 6% of their overall Measure B program expenditures.

7. Technical Exchange

7.1. Mobility Management

Naomi Armenta noted the great response from the May 30th Travel Training Working Group Meeting held at the Alameda CTC offices. New TAC members that were present at the meeting included Pam Deaton from Pleasanton and Kevin Laven from Emeryville as their paratransit programs includes a travel training component. The next meeting is scheduled to take place in early September.

7.2. Preparedness

The Alameda County Public Health Department is working on a pilot program for emergency preparedness. Staff has established a working relationship with Donata Nilson and has provided her with some background information on the agency's efforts.

7.3. Ask a TAC Member

There was no discussion.

7.4. Other Technical Exchange Items

There was no discussion.

8. Information Items

8.1. SRAC Update

The last SRAC Meeting took place on May 7th. The major items on the agenda included the update on the RFP and the new Mobility Management project conducted by Nelson\Nygaard. Veolia Transportation received the award for the RFP and was the only bidder during the application process. Also, Cathleen Sullivan gave an update on the new Mobility Resources Inventory project. She noted that the first step is to survey all of the existing transportation service providers in the areas that East Bay Paratransit services, including Contra Costa and Alameda Counties. The purpose of this project is to compile all of the information received and to create an online database that will be accessible to anyone seeking specific program and/or service information.

8.2. PAPCO Update

Officer elections will take place at the next PAPCO Meeting on June 24th. Also, the workshop planning is well underway and will take place on July 1st at the Ed Roberts Campus.

8.3. Alameda CTC Staff Report

There was no Alameda CTC staff report.

8.4. Outreach

Krystle Pasco gave an update on PAPCO's outreach activities. She noted that staff recently attended the Four Seasons of Health Expo in Fremont on June 7th and will be attending the Senior Days at the Alameda County Fair on June 20th and June 27th.

8.5. TAC Committee Member Announcements

American Logistics will no longer be the transportation provider for the LAVTA/Wheels paratransit program. More information will be provided by staff soon.

Learn BART! booklets will be reprinted in English and will now be available in various languages including Spanish and Chinese. These booklets will be available at the Mobility Workshop on July 1st.
