	The majority of VRF expenditures were allocated toward the Annual Resurfacing of City Streets CIP 125003. Project bids were lower than expected providing surplus funding. The funding was then reallocated to a new project, CIP 125024 (Stoneridge Dr & Vineyard Ave overlay), but the project could not begin construction until after FY 12/13. Construction has been completed and will be reflected in FY 13/14 expenditures.		
5.	If applicable, why were the reported expenditures in FY 12-13 more than the amount of VRF funds the agency received in FY 12-13? How did you use VRF funds from a previous fiscal year(s)?		
	N/A – Did not use all of the funds allocated this year.

	Reserve funds have been allocated in our Capital Improvement Program for use toward our Pavement Management Program projects. Remaining reserve funds from previous fiscal years' reserves are expected to be expended on CIP 135003 (Annual Resurfacing of City Streets). FY 12/13 funding was placed in the reserve per the City's Capital Improvement Program budget to be expended on FY 14/15 projects.

A new project was developed and put out to bid, but could not be completed before the end of FY12/13. The project has since been completed and a new project, CIP 135003 is under design, incorporating the reserve VRF funding.

	CIP 125003 Annual Resurfacing of Various City Streets – Project bids came in lower than expected and Measure B reserve funds were used to reduce Measure B fund balance. The remaining VRF balance was transferred to a new project, CIP 125024 that went to construction after FY 12/13.
