The City of San Leandro has placed VRF funds into reserves for three projects listed here:

- 1. Annual overlay/rehab 2012-13 project
- 2. Annual overlay/rehab 2013-14 project
- 3. Annual overlay/rehab 2013-14 project

The timeline for using the funds on each of these projects is shown in table 3. Each July 1 the council allocates funding for new capital projects. Projects that include pavement are bid the following spring for construction during the warm weather of the following summer.
