Goods Movement Collaborative and Plan – An Integrated Approach

Goods Movement Collaborative

- Bring together partners/stakeholders
- Serve as organized structure for the Goods movement
 - Policy development
 - Planning in Alameda County and the region
 - Advocacy for goods movement projects and programs

Goods Movement Plan

- Develop long-range vision and identify the following:
 - Needs and short- and long-term priorities
 - Benefits goods movement in Alameda County brings to the nation, state and region

- Leadership Team: Alameda CTC, MTC, Caltrans, Port of Oakland, East Bay EDA
- Technical Team
- Focus Groups

Update on Collaborative and Plan Progress

- Leadership Team Kick-off in July 2013:
 - Refine purpose, roles and goals of Collaborative and integration of planning efforts
 - Finalize implementation schedule for short and long-term collaborative actions
 - Identify technical and focus group participants
 - Establish goal for first Roundtable
- Finalize Planning schedule to identify short and long range priorities
- Release of Goods Movement Plan RFP:
 - Released July 1
 - Selected consultant expected to begin October 1
- Completed inventory of Plans as first step in needs assessment

Integration with other Goods Movement Activities

- National Freight Advisory Committee
- State Freight Advisory Committee
- Mega-region coordination
- Caltrans District 4 Goods Movement Study

Integration with other Goods Movement Activities: NFAC

- National Freight Advisory Committee*
 - July 2013: DOT develops work plan
 - September through December 2013: NFAC subcommittees develop recommendations
 - May 2014: DOT drafts framework for the national strategy
 - December 2014 through April 2015: DOT drafts the national strategy
 - September 2015: Strategic plan drafted

Integration with other Goods Movement Activities: CFAC

- California Freight Advisory Committee
 - December 2013: Develop initial project list
 - December 2014: Finalize project list and plan that will be integrated into the update of the 2040 California Transportation Plan (CTP)
 - CTP:
 - statewide, long-range transportation plan to meet future mobility needs and reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions
 - state-level transportation blueprint that articulates the State's vision for an integrated multimodal transportation system that complements regional transportation plans and land use visions.
 - December 2015: CTP approved by Secretary of Transportation.

Integration with other Goods Movement Activities: Mega-Region Coordination

- Mega-Region Coordination
 - Alameda CTC
 - MTC
 - San Joaquin
 - Sacramento

Integration with other Goods Movement Activities: Caltrans District 4 Plan

- Caltrans, District 4 Bay Area Freight Mobility Study
 - June-July 2013: Inventory of facilities and needs
 - July- Sept. 2013: Assessment of current and future trends and impacts
 - August- Oct. 2013: Freight improvement strategies, performance measures and impact mitigation strategies
 - Sept. – Nov. 2013: Emerging trends, future studies
 - December 2013: Final report
- Alameda CTC plan activities are being integrated with Caltrans/MTC study to avoid duplication of efforts

Long-term Support of Collaborative

- Incorporation into Alameda CTC workplan, legislative program and funding
- Incorporation into partner agency workplans, legislative programs and funding

- September 2013: Establish initial project list
- October 2013: Hire consultant
- On-going: Influence federal and state goods movement efforts
