Paratransit Technical Advisory Committee Meeting Minutes

Tuesday, January 8, 2019, 9:30 a.m.

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1. Call to Order and Roll Call

Krystle Pasco called the meeting to order and a roll call was conducted. All members were present with the exception of Dana Bailey, Susan Criswell, Brad Helfenberger, Ely Hwang, Hakeim McGee and Laura Timothy.

Subsequent to the roll call:

Hakeim McGee arrived during Introductions. Dana Bailey arrived during item 4.3.

2. Public Comment

There were no public comments.

3. Administration

3.1. Review the September 11, 2018 ParaTAC Meeting Minutes Committee members received the September 11, 2018 ParaTAC meeting minutes and agreed by acclamation.

3.2. Review the FY 2018-19 ParaTAC Meeting Calendar

The FY 2018-19 ParaTAC meeting calendar was provided in the agenda packet for review purposes.

3.3. PAPCO Roster

The PAPCO roster was provided in the agenda packet for review purposes.

3.4. Paratransit Outreach Calendar

The paratransit outreach calendar was provided in the agenda packet for review purposes. Kim Ridgeway informed the Committee that the Transition Information Faire will be held on March 23, 2019. Robin Mariona stated that the Albany Resource Fair will be held on April 18, 2019.

4. Paratransit Programs and Projects

4.1. Receive FY 2019-20 Paratransit Direct Local Distribution (DLD) Projections Update

Naomi Armenta presented this agenda item. She reiterated that Measure B and Measure BB paratransit Direct Local Distribution (DLD) funding is split by planning area and within each planning area by a formula adopted by PAPCO. Ms. Armenta reviewed the funding distributions as stated in both the 2000 and 2014 Transportation Expenditure Plans (TEPs). She reviewed the percentage of funds allocated to ADA-mandated paratransit services/East Bay Paratransit, City-based services, and the discretionary grant program as stated in the TEPs.

Ms. Armenta also stated that the 2014 TEP specifies the percentage allocated to cities and local transit operators will be distributed to each of the four planning areas based on the percentage of the population over age 70. Once the planning area distribution is determined, the funding formula to allocate funding within each planning area is applied. Ms. Armenta stated that the income data for the funding formula is based on the American Community Survey data.

She then reviewed the draft FY 2019-20 DLD projections and noted that these estimates should be used by ParaTAC members for their Program Plan application. The applications are due to Alameda CTC by late February 2019.

Shawn Fong asked if the income category is for a household of one or more. Ms. Pasco stated that staff will look into this and will follow up with the Committee.

Shawn Fong asked if the funding formula for Measure BB is set for the entire length of the measure based on the population over 70 within each planning area. She also asked if the funding formula within the planning areas based on disability, age and income could be changed within the Master Program Funding Agreements (MPFAs). Ms. Armenta said that the planning area split is based on the 2014 TEP and the funding formula is approved by PAPCO. Both cannot be changed within the MPFAs.

Julie Parkinson asked if all factors are weighted equally. Ms. Armenta said all factors are weighted equally with the exception of disability. In this case, PAPCO adopted a formula that weighs seniors over the age of 80 more heavily (multiplied by 1.5) due to the fact that many seniors do not identify as disabled.

Ms. Pasco noted that the projections will be updated in the May timeframe and she will notify the Committee when they become available.

4.2. FY 2019-20 Program Plan Application Discussion

Krystle Pasco presented this item. Ms. Pasco informed the Committee that the program plan application was released in January, which was earlier than prior fiscal years. She stated that the subcommittee dates are Monday, April 22 and Tuesday, April 23, 2019. She reviewed the updates to the FY 2019-20 Program Plan application and schedule.

Shawn Fong asked for additional background information for providing average trip length and common trip destinations. Ms. Pasco asked the Committee to continue to provide information regarding average trip length and common trip destinations that are already being collected. Naomi said that the wish is to get as much information on the new programs utilizing Lyft and Uber.

Victoria Williams asked if the information can be by category. Staff said yes.

Shawn Fong said the City of Fremont does not track their trips by trip length. Staff acknowledged that this is okay and no information needs to be provided if it is not already being collected.

4.3. 2020 Paratransit Discretionary Grant Program Update (Verbal)

Krystle Pasco stated that the Commission approved the release of the 2020 Paratransit Discretionary Grant Program call for projects at their September 2018 meeting. The call for projects was released in early November and applications were due in mid-December. Ms. Pasco stated that 15 applications were received from 13 sponsors, requesting over \$10.5 million over the 5-year grant period. She stated that staff is currently evaluating the applications and will forward a recommendation to PAPCO at their January 28, 2019 meeting.

Shawn Fong asked if there were scoring criteria guidelines. Ms. Pasco stated that there is scoring criteria and it can be found in the priorities that PAPCO approved in spring 2018. Alameda CTC will have a scoring and advisory panel that consists of staff members and Nelson\Nygaard representatives. She noted that the scoring criteria is similar to the 2018 CIP and Gap Grant Cycle 5.

Shawn Fong then asked if the amount of funding available is intended for the five year grant period. Ms. Pasco said that \$9 million is available for the five year programming period.

4.4. Mobility Management Update (Verbal)

Naomi Armenta provided a report on the December 6, 2018 Countywide Mobility Management and Travel Training meeting. She noted that the meeting was well attended.

Kate Lefkowitz informed the Committee that a Joint PAPCO and ParaTAC meeting is planned for February 25, 2019 and the topics for discussion are emerging mobility services and an update on SB 1376 implementation, which is the Transportation Network Companies (TNCs) Accessibility for Persons with Disabilities Act.

4.5. Emergency Preparedness Update

There were no updates on Emergency Preparedness.

4.6. Exchange Technical Information

Victoria Williams asked if there were any Committee members working with TNCs already and how those partnerships are going. Dana Bailey said the City of Hayward is partnering with LIFE ElderCare for Lyft and Uber services. She noted that as of January 1st, Hayward moved their data base over to LIFE ElderCare and so far the clients are pleased. She also said that some of the taxi drivers are looking at the LIFE ElderCare VIP program. Ms. Bailey informed the Committee that Hayward's TNC workshop will take

place on January 23, 2019 and Committee members are welcome to attend.

Kim Ridgeway asked if the pilot program has run into issues with individuals that do not have a debit or credit card. Ms. Bailey responded that the program has not encountered that issue yet.

Shawn Fong said that the City of Fremont, on behalf of the Tri-Cities, is looking at a pilot project with TNCs and is aiming to move forward with the project by partnering with LIFE ElderCare for a program similar to Hayward's.

Kadri Kulm said that Wheels has the GoDublin program, which includes Uber, Lyft, and the DeSoto Cab Company. She noted that Uber added wheelchair accessible vehicles recently. Ms. Armenta stated that Uber contracted with MV Transportation, because they have accessible vehicles.

Hakim McGee asked if funds from one DLD category can be used in another DLD category, such as local streets and roads (LSR) funds going towards paratransit needs. Ms. Armenta stated that with Measure B funds, LSR money is intended for transportation improvements and it is flexible for jurisdictions to use broadly for transportation needs. However, paratransit funds must be utilized to improve transportation and mobility for seniors and people with disabilities.

Julie Parkinson gave an update on the City of Pleasanton paratransit service drivers' software, which has been automated. Ms. Parkinson said they will deploy their automated call software, TripSpark, very soon.

Hakeim McGee asked if any other Committee members have funding reserve issues. Victoria Williams stated that the City of Alameda is looking to make accessibility improvements with their reserve funds.

5. Committee and Transit Reports

5.1. PAPCO Update

Krystle Pasco informed the Committee that the next PAPCO meeting is taking place on January 28, 2019 and a Joint PAPCO and ParaTAC meeting will be taking place on February 25, 2019.

5.2. ADA and Transit Advisory Committee Updates

Shawn Fong noted that there was an EBP Service Review Advisory Committee meeting on January 7, 2019. She provided an overview of the Committee's discussion.

Kim Ridgeway stated that the AC Transit Accessibility Advisory Committee last met on December 11, 2018. She informed the Committee that AC Transit will be piloting solar powered real-time signs with WaySine. Ms. Ridgeway noted that the pilot project will begin in the spring.

6. Member Reports

Julie Parkinson informed the Committee that she is retiring at the end of January. Hakiem McGee stated that his ParaTAC alternate, Jendayi Santana received a promotion as the Senior Center Director in West Oakland.

7. Staff Reports

Naomi Armenta reported that staff held a ParaTAC Orientation in December 2018 for new Committee members. Ms. Armenta stated that staff will likely schedule future Orientations on a quarterly basis as needed.

8. Adjournment

The meeting adjourned at 10:45 a.m.

Projections for Future Years

Recommendation

Receive simulated projections for future years of Paratransit Direct Local Distribution (DLD) funding.

Summary

On March 12, 2019, ParaTAC will receive simulated projections of paratransit DLD funding for approximately five future years.

Background

Planning Areas

The Alameda County Transportation Commission (Alameda CTC) divides the County into four planning areas:

- North County the cities of Alameda, Albany, Berkeley, Emeryville, Oakland, and Piedmont
- Central County the cities of Hayward, San Leandro, and unincorporated areas

- South County the cities of Fremont, Newark, Union City, and Union City Transit
- East County the cities of Dublin, Pleasanton, Livermore, unincorporated areas, and LAVTA

Measures B and BB Paratransit DLD funding is split by planning area as directed in the 2000 Measure B and 2014 Measure BB transportation sales tax expenditure plans and within each planning area to each city by a formula adopted by PAPCO. The details for how funding is distributed is described below.

Measure B Planning Area Funding Distribution

Per Alameda CTC's 2000 Transportation Expenditure Plan (TEP), 10.45% of Measure B funds go to specialized transportation for seniors and people with disabilities, as follows:

- 5.63% allocated to ADA-mandated paratransit services
- 3.39% allocated to non-mandated paratransit services
- 1.43% allocated to the Gap Grant Program

The 2000 TEP also specifies that the 3.39% allocated to non-mandated paratransit services be distributed to the planning areas as follows:

- North County = 1.24%
- Central County = 0.88%
- South County = 1.06%
- East County = 0.21%

These allocations were determined as part of the negotiations to craft the 2000 TEP for Measure B sales tax revenues.

Measure BB Planning Area Funding Distribution

Per Alameda CTC's 2014 TEP, 10% of Measure BB funds are allocated to affordable transit for seniors and people with disabilities, as follows:

- 6% allocated to East Bay Paratransit Consortium
- 3% allocated to cities and local transit operators

• 1% allocated for service gaps and coordination

The 2014 TEP also specifies that the 3% allocated to cities and local transit operators will be distributed to each of the four planning areas based on the percentage of the population over age 70.

Measures B and BB Funding Formula for City Funding Distribution

Both Measure B and BB specify that PAPCO develops, and the Alameda CTC Commission adopts, a funding formula to allocate funding within each planning area to the individual agency recipients. Funds from a planning area may not be transferred to another area. PAPCO voted to use the same formula for both funding sources.

In establishing the funding formula, PAPCO and ParaTAC took three areas into account that impact a community's need for accessible transportation: age, disability, and income. The formula includes the following factors to measure these areas of concern: population over 70, population with a disability, and low-income population. The source for all data is the American Community Survey (ACS) which was deemed to be most accurate. In acknowledgement that many older seniors do not identify themselves as disabled, and therefore may not

be captured by ACS data, PAPCO adopted a formula that weighs seniors over the age of 80 more heavily (multiplied by 1.5).

In January 2017, PAPCO took action to extend the funding formula for the same length of time as the Master Program Funding Agreements, through 2027, with annual updates of ACS data. The table below shows the factors included in the current funding formula for both Measure B and BB funds.

Factor	Description	Data Source

The draft DLD estimates for all cities for FY 2019-20 were provided to ParaTAC in January for preparation of the FY 2019-20 Program Plans, due in late February.

Funding Simulation for Future Years

Within the next five years, Measure B will sunset and Measure BB will expand to dictate expenditures for the full 1% sales tax, as shown in the table on the following page. At the ParaTAC meeting, staff will provide a very high level simulation of funding percentages to help ParaTAC members begin to plan ahead for shifts in funding related to the transition.

Several important factors should be taken into account when considering the simulation:

- Projected formula data for FY 2019-20 was used as a baseline.
- Alameda CTC projects an increase in sales tax revenue each year. Recent projected increases were approximately 3%.
- Planning area percentages will change each year with new ACS data available for population over 70. In recent years, changes have been small. New data has resulted in shifts of less than one percentage point between planning areas.
- Funding formula percentages will change each year with new ACS data for all funding formula factors. In recent years, these have also been small. New data has resulted in shifts of less than one percentage point between cities.

Fiscal Impact: There is no net fiscal impact associated with the requested action.

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
