## State Transit Assistance (STA) Overview

- STA revenues generated through a statewide tax on the sale of diesel fuel
- Amount of STA revenue can vary greatly from year to year based on fluctuations in diesel prices
- Transit agencies are the only eligible direct recipients of STA funds
- Eligible uses include both capital projects and transit operations

## State Transit Assistance (STA) Overview

#### **STA Program Structure**

• STA formula splits statewide revenue 50/50 between:

#### Revenue-Based program

• Funds flow through the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) to transit operators based on their qualifying local revenue.

#### > Population-Based program

• Funds flow to the Bay Area based on the region's share of the State's population and are programmed by MTC.

### STA County Block Grant Program

#### MTC's STA Population-Based Program:

- In 2018, MTC's STA Policy Framework, Resolution 4321, replaced Resolution 3837:
  - > 70% directed towards a transit-focused STA County Block Grant program
  - > 30% directed towards a Regional component administered directly by MTC to support Clipper, 511, and regional means-based fare program
- Revised framework only impacted programming methodology and not the amount of STA Population-based funds flowing to Alameda County, which remains 17.68%
  - > STA Block Grant funds to Alameda County estimated \$6M \$8M annually

### STA County Block Grant Program

#### Alameda County's STA Block Grant Program

- Adopted by the Commission in April 2018, continues to distribute funds according to the three categories established in the original MTC STA Policy:
  - > Small Operator Guarantee
    - Minimum 24% of annual funds, as required by MTC STA Block Grant policy
  - > Regional Paratransit/Mobility Management
    - 25% of annual funds, consistent with amount distributed under prior MTC STA policy
  - > Lifeline/ Means-Based Program
    - 51% of annual funds formula-based distribution
    - Operators to use funds to benefit low-income riders (capital or operating)
    - Includes a 50% set-aside for the Affordable Student Transit Pass Program

## STA County Block Grant Recommendation

#### Proposed distribution formula for FYs 2021-22 & 2022-23:

- · No changes to:
  - > Approved program categories and sub-categories;
  - > Funding distribution to each program category; and
  - > Funding distribution within the STPP sub-category, based on operators' estimated STPP participation for FY.
- Updated:
  - > Funding distribution within the Lifeline sub-category updated to reflect operators' share of low-income ridership, based on latest rider income survey data available from MTC.

## STA County Block Grant Schedule

| Date        | STA County Block Grant Program Milestone  |
|-------------|---|
| April 2021  | Approve STA formula for FYs 2021-22 & 2022-23.  |
| May 1, 2021 | Commission-approved STA formula due to MTC, and FY 2019-20 Program reporting due to MTC |
| Summer 2021 | Operators work with MTC to access FY 2021-22 STA funding                                |
| May 1, 2022 | FY 2020-21 Program reporting due to MTC   |
| Spring 2023 | Next review of STA Distribution Formula (every two years)                               |
