






Freight Rail Operations





- Freight train volumes determined by market demands for goods and by rail infrastructure constraints
- South Bay Connect is <u>not expected to affect freight traffic</u> <u>volumes</u> in project area
- Continuing discussions with UP on necessary improvements

While South Bay Connect improves passenger rail efficiency, the project will not affect freight train frequency.




