### Background

- Governor's Executive Order N-19-19: leverage state transportation spending to help meet state climate goals
- Governor's Executive Order N-79-20: expand clean transportation options
- California State Transportation Agency charged with developing Climate Action Plan for Transportation Infrastructure (CAPTI)
- Draft Plan is out for public comment until May 4, 2021
- Submittal to Governor and Legislature by July 15, 2021

## State Transportation Funding Programs

- Leverage transportation funding to reach climate goals
- State agencies play a role in over \$5 billion of transportation infrastructure funding annually
  - > Active Transportation Program
  - > Interregional Transportation Improvement Program
  - > Local Partnerships Program
  - Solutions for Congested Corridors
  - > State Highway Operations and Protection Program
  - > Trade Corridor Enhancement Program
  - > Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program
