Voter Approved Measures

Measure B (MB)

- In 2000, Measure B reauthorized the previous 1986 half-cent sales tax
- Measure B sunsets March 31, 2022

Measure BB (MBB)


- In 2014, Measure BB authorized augmentation and extension of Measure B
- On April 1, 2015, half-cent sales tax collections began
- On April 1, 2022 Measure BB becomes a full-penny sales tax


Measure F - Vehicle Registration Fee (VRF)

• In 2010, voters authorized a collection of an annual \$10 per vehicle registration fee

DLD Program Overview

- Over 50% of net revenues generated from the Measure B/BB/BB Programs are returned to source as "Direct Local Distributions" (DLDs)
- Twenty recipients (cities, transit agencies and the County)
- DLD Programs
 - Bicycle/Pedestrian
 - Local Streets and Roads (local transportation)
 - > Transit
 - Special Transportation for Seniors and People with Disabilities (Paratransit)



DLD Compliance Monitoring

- Annual Program Compliance Reports and Audited Financial Statements (due in December)
- Currently reports for the FY 2020-21 reporting year is under review by Alameda CTC and the Independent Watchdog Committee
- In June 2022, Commission will receive a compliance summary update





Measure B/BB/VRF Programs Update

DLD Programs Policy Updates

PROPOSED TIMELY USE OF FUNDS POLICY

- RECIPIENT may not hold an end of fiscal year fund balance of greater than four-times their annual DLD revenue received for that same fiscal year, by respective Measure B, Measure BB, and VRF Program. The Cities of Albany, Emeryville, and Piedmont are excluded from this requirement.
- ➤ All Measure B RECIPIENT must expend all Measure B DLD funds and all interest earned thereon by June 30, 2026.

<u>Non-compliance</u>: Must return the equal amount of DLD funds that exceeds the maximum allowable end of fiscal year fund balance, as approved by the Commission.

DLD Programs Policy Updates

PARATRANSIT PROGRAM COST ELIGIBILITIES

1. Meals Delivery Program

Extend meal delivery program cost eligibility among all DLD recipients through June 30, 2023

- Funds eligibility limited to Transportation Purposes only
- Same Day Transportation Services/Accessible Van Service
 Extend reduction of minimum age eligibility requirement from 70 to 60 years old through June 30, 2023

Measure B/BB/VRF Discretionary Programs





- Discretionary program objectives
 - Improve transportation access
 - · Increase safety and mobility
 - Support alternative and active transportation
 - Transit oriented developments
- Discretionary program guidelines and awards are approved by the Commission through the Comprehensive Investment Plan (CIP) process

<u>City of San Leandro</u> San Leandro Rehabilitation Project

Project Description:

San Leandro Rehabilitation project will repair and/or replace pavement on existing streets within the city. Work may include repair or replacement of road base, adjustment of utility lines and structures, replacement of striping, and installation of ADA complaint curb ramps.

<u>City of Emeryville</u> South Bayfront Bridge Bike/Pedestrian Bridge

Project Description:

Construct 227 foot-long steel tied-arch pedestrian/bicycle bridge over the Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) tracks with concrete approach ramps

Total Cost	\$22.1	М
Emeryville	\$20.1	M
TFCA	\$ 0.9	Μ
Measure B Bike/Ped	\$ 1.9	М

<u>Various Sponsors</u> Safe Routes to School Mini-Grants

Project Description:

Upcoming Discretionary Programming

- This April, Commission will consider the approval of the 2024 CIP Call for Projects
 - Over \$100 M in discretionary funds available for a coordinated call for projects of Measure B/BB/VRF/TFCA and One Bay Area Grant (OBAG) Cycle 3 funds
 - > Five fiscal years horizon: FY 2023-24 to 2027-28

- 2. One-year extension of Paratransit Cost Eligibilities

 - Same Day Transportation Services/Accessible Van Service minimum age (60)
